- It allows researchers to document what they intend to achieve with the research from the outset.






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
Participants Details




A variety of participants across various age groups participated in the online research methodology workshop. Participants from the age group ranging from 23 to 49 participated in the research methodology workshop.





Satisfaction Level



Content of Workshop


