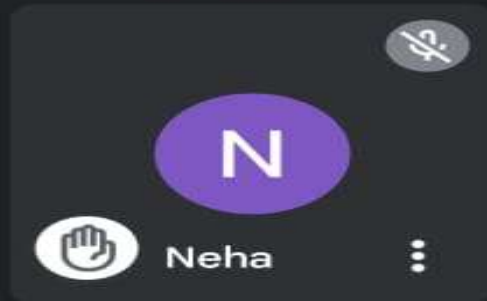
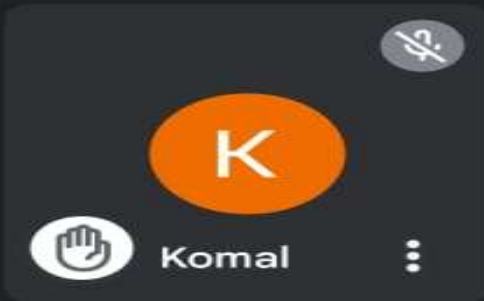

The class was very interesting and interactive with the participation of around 40 B.com final year students from both the college. The 45 Minutes session came to an end with more new knowledge for the students.



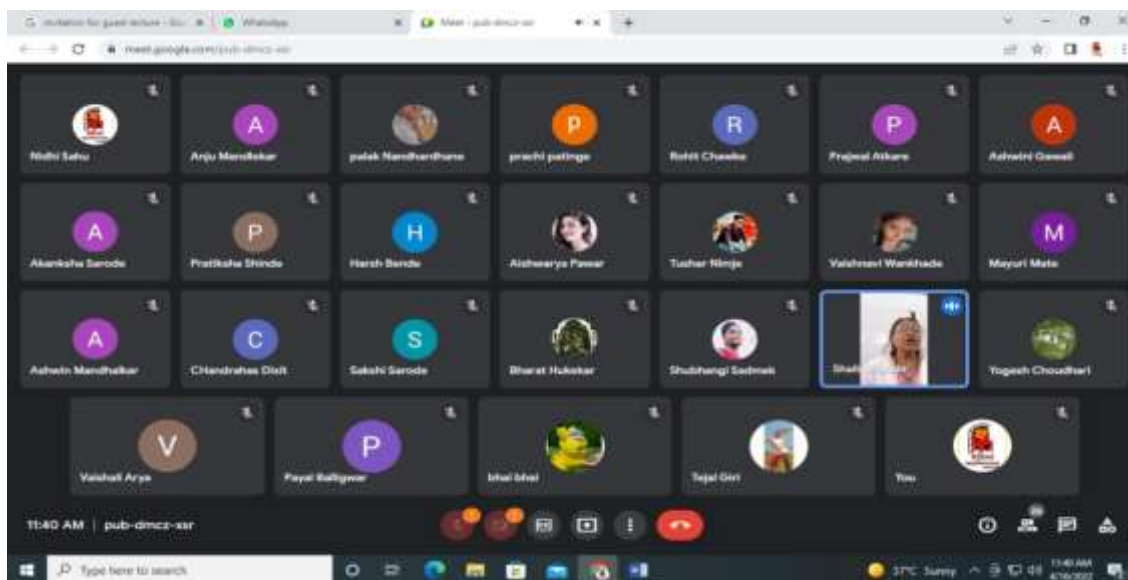

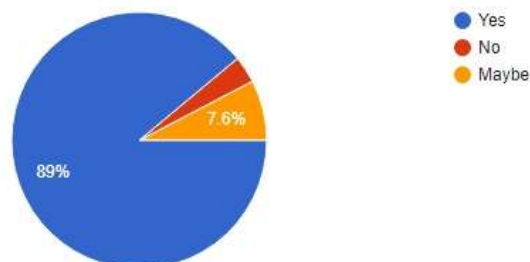
How satisfied were you with this activity ?
